
# to make a pooter

### What you need:

- plasticine
- · jar with lid (
- · 40cm of clear, flexible plastic tubing, 7-10cm Wide (try a big DIY Store)
- · a small piece of gauze, net curtains or tights
- elastic band
- da Jana Andra La Lachada Andra Jana Jana Lan Lan Stickers or tape · green and red

- (1) Make 2 holes in the lid to help with this) (ask an adult
- (2) Cut 2 lengths of tubing
- about 15cm and 25cm long and poke them through the holes.
- 3) Put the gauze over the 14 with a green sticker/ and mark the other end end of the shorter tube

- with a ved sticker/tape (ved vneans 'dan't suck (4) Mark the longer tube this tube).
- to make them airtight. avound the tube holes (5) Put some plasticine
